DELEGATION

Kinistino Rink Board

Gerald Van Burgsteden, President, and Todd Ilnisky, Kinistino Rink Board appeared before Council to thank the City and the Minor Hockey Association for giving them the opportunity to provide a sport complex to meet the immediate needs of the City, as detailed in his letter dated March 29, 2016. He added that 20% of their facility use is by Melfort minor hockey. Council members thanked the Kinistino Rink Board for their assistance.

Prairie Panels Ltd.

Mr. Jim Goodlad referred to the proposal submitted by Prairie Panels Ltd. to construct a secondary arena on the original Main Arena site, and advised that the company is still interested in working with the City to develop a turn-key, high energy efficient, expandable, long-term facility at the Spruce Haven Park location for a budget between \$5.5 and \$6 Million. He reported that a refurbished facility close to this design would be the Harold Latrace arena in Saskatoon. They are also under construction in Stoughton and Perdue. Mayor Lang thanked Mr. Goodlad for his presentation and advised that a timeline on construction of a second arena has not yet been defined.

Melfort Minor Hockey

Mr. Brad Hicks, President of the Melfort Minor Hockey Association, expressed appreciation for the support from nearby communities in keeping their association functioning; however, he stated that this can only be acceptable in the short-term in order to keep a vibrant hockey program in Melfort. He shared the following concerns with the current situation:

- The lack of a second arena puts hockey out of reach for many children due to out-of-town travel, extra costs, and inconsistent practise times.
- Early practise time impacts the enjoyment for many children and negatively affects their school day. Out of town travel is costly for families and adds complexity to their schedule. Many young teams only play 25% of their home games in Melfort.
- There is a huge cost impact to pay refs for out-of-town travel, and it is a challenge for young officials that can't drive.

- Tournaments are traditionally a major source of revenue for minor hockey, local business and concession sales. Registration is down for the second straight year and Minor Hockey has seen a 45% reduction in revenue.

Mayor Lang thanked Mr. Hicks for his presentation and commented that City Council recognizes the want and need for a second arena; however, when looking at the big picture, Council has to be careful about compromising the financial stability of the City. He inquired whether Minor Hockey has discussed the initiation of any fundraising, to which Mr. Hicks responded that they have discussed fundraising and when the City has made a commitment and puts a timeline in place, they would be willing to support it.
