DELEGATIONS

Melfort & District Museum Board – 2017 Annual Report

Mr. Allan Porter, Chairman of the Melfort & District Museum Board, presented the 2017 Annual Report to Council, noting their involvement in Hrytzak-Morgan collection and their receipt of a grant to create archival storage space on the second floor of the Power House. The Board has also been in discussions with the Saskatoon Western Development Museum about obtaining a 1912 caboose and is considering whether they have the resources required to preserve and protect it. Mr. Porter invited Council to attend a live-history workshop and round-table banquet on May 4, led by a group from Ontario. Mayor Lang recognized the commitment of the Museum Board and volunteers and thanked them for their service. Mr. Porter thanked Council for their continuing support.

Chad Vanderbyl - Airport Fuel Surcharge

Mr. Vanderbyl appeared before Council to request a one-time fee per annum as a fuel surcharge, rather than the existing \$0.15, which he feels is excessive compared to other airports in the province and the country. As a member of the Saskatchewan Aerial Applicators' Board, he is involved in working with cities on fire fighting plans. To Councillor Terry's question, Mr. Vanderbyl clarified that he is not against the principle of a fuel surcharge, just the rate. Councillor Terry replied that the Melfort Airport is situated in the RM and all taxation goes directly to the RM, leaving the City responsible for all operating costs of the airport. The purpose of the surcharge is to recover a portion of those operating costs, it is not meant to be a barrier to his business. Mr. Vanderbyl advised that he does receive a bulk fuel discount of \$0.03 and agreed that he was aware of the surcharge when he leased his hangar lot. Mayor Lang referred the request to the Works & Utilities Committee for review.
