### 18-171 HISTORIC POST OFFICE WINDOW REPLACEMENT FINANCING:

MitchellWHEREAS, to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the first Melfort Post Office, establishedPhillipsin 1892, the Government of Canada has approved a Legacy Grant of \$100,000, to be<br/>matched by the City of Melfort, to replace all windows in the historic post office with historic<br/>replicas;

AND WHEREAS, the completion of the Historic Post Office Window Replacement Project will assist in reducing operational costs and facilitate the use of this building, particularly the marketing of the north annex;

AND WHEREAS, on submission of the revised tender from the low bidder, there remains an approximate shortfall of \$50,000 between the revised project budget of \$250,000 and the \$200,000 revenues raised thus far through grants and fundraising;

BE IT RESOLVED THAT in order to meet the requirements of the Government of Canada Legacy Grant and maximize the 50/50 funding, we approve upfront financing of \$50,000 to complete the Historic Post Office Window Replacement Project by March 31, 2019, with the understanding that the Preservation and Rehabilitation Committee will continue their fundraising efforts. The funding source is to be determined by the City Treasurer. **Carried**
