DELEGATIONS

Allison Enns Request for 4-way Stop – Bemister Ave/Scotia Street

Ms. Allison Enns appeared before Council to request the installation of a four-way stop at the corner of Bemister Avenue and Scotia Street, due to the safety issue posed by speeders, distracted and inattentive drivers. She has been reporting issues to the police and City Hall for two years, as well as the school. Non-local traffic and pedestrian traffic is increasing and traffic is not yielding to pedestrians. She feels a four-way stop is the best and cheapest option to control traffic at the intersection. The proposed sidewalk on the north side of Bemister does nothing to curb the speed in the school zones, is expensive to build and maintain, and will not deter children from crossing at the Bemister/Scotia intersection. Closing the northeast access of the school grounds will not change the children's destination and will increase congestion in front of the school. Ms. Enns noted that all other corners of the school have hard stops, which help to curb speeds, and she is asking Council to extend the current standard to the Bemister Ave/Scotia Street intersection. Mayor Lang advised that the City is working with a traffic engineer to evaluate all four corners and Ms. Enns' comments and concerns will be considered as part of the evaluation. Councillor Mitchell asked Administration to expedite this study.

Ruisseau East Developments – Request for Rezone

Ryan and Amy Tremblay spoke to their new development proposal for semi-detached, bungalow-style homes on the west leg of Orr Drive. They received a positive response from their door-to-door presentations and explained that Ruisseau East Developments will purchase all six lots to ensure control over the development. They are willing to place restrictions on the development, such as a minimum square footage equal to R1A/owner-occupied. Mr. Tremblay stated that their development will result in property values equal or greater than some of the existing homes in the neighborhood. To Councillor Terry's question, Mr. Tremblay advised that the homes will look similar, but they are not all the same plan. Ruisseau would like to build 2-4 immediately, with the remainder of the development complete in 2-3 years. Mayor Lang thanked Mr. & Mrs. Tremblay for their presentation.
